The Truth About Book Reviews

You love books. So do I. And whether you realize it or not, what you write, say, or post matters.

Not just to the author, the publisher, and other readers, but to YOU, the reviewer!

Obviously, readers can and should review books whenever and however you wish. That said, there are forces working behind the scenes that I certainly didn't realize until I published my own books. As is my way, I like to pass along these tidbits of inside information. I realize some or all of these pearls of wisdom may be controversial. Do with them what you please.

In a <u>recent blog post</u>, I offer some detailed suggestions for composing book reviews without spraining your brain. I hope you'll check those out, but before you do, here are 3 truths you need to know about book reviews:

Reviews matter. A lot.

About those stars: Regardless of your own personal weighting system, star ratings lower than 3/5 can really damage a book's chance for success. As for the words: When time is short or you're not sure what to say, a one-liner counts too!

- Reviews aren't just for readers.
 Authors (especially indie authors) not only read them, we scour reviews for quotable snippets to share in our marketing materials.
- **READ THE BOOK** before you review it. Enough said.

Now if all of that is a bit too real and you're wondering if it's all worth the trouble, here are a few wonderful things that may happen if you DO choose to review that book you just finished:

- Publishers may reach out to offer you advance reader copies and exclusive sneak peeks of highly desirable upcoming releases. That's potentially a lot of free books.
 Fame and fortune
 "Book influencers" are the darlings of social media. Who knows where any one of your review posts might
 - Reviews are a great way to meet fellow book lovers!

Buddy reads can turn into book groups and just think of all the new recommendations (and friends!) you'll get.
